Assistance Dogs of the West (ADW) is a 501c3 nonprofit founded in 1995 with the core value of respect for the unique abilities found in humans and dogs. Using an innovative model in which diverse student populations support professional instructors with the dog training process, ADW has attained a record of stellar client placement success and an assistance dog student training program which builds community, compassion and leadership of the youth and military veteran participants.

To date, ADW has provided highly trained assistance dogs (aka "service dogs") to more than 300 client recipients ages 5 to 95. Our dogs provide support to children and families challenged by mobility impairments, autism, developmental disabilities, seizure disorders, diabetes, and psychiatric/emotional issues. We also train and place Facility Dogs in criminal justice, mental health, physical health, and occupational therapy settings as well as children's advocacy centers and with crisis first responders. Professionals teamed with their dogs help clients mediate trauma, respond to mass events, and support independence for those with disabilities and mental health conditions.
