Customized Training for Healthcare Workers

This 6-hour, facilitated training gives New Mexico frontline health care workers the opportunity to explore topics and issues that are fundamental to their profession. The training covers the key concepts of person-centered care, quality care, self-care, the rights and responsibilities of caregivers and care recipients, effective communication, diet and nutrition, medication management and infection prevention. Participants will also learn about and practice hands-on skills involved in safe transfers and in supporting care recipients in their activities of daily living (ADLs). Career pathways in the frontline health care workforce are presented and discussed.
