The outpatient services offered provide individual, group, and family counseling for Native Americans seeking chemical dependency treatment in a caring and supportive atmosphere. Recognizing that addiction is a family illness that is treatable, Circle of Life Behavioral Health Network strives to work with the individual and his/her system of significant others to develop a program of healthy recovery utilizing a holistic approach in addition to using Motivational Interviewing and Community Reinforcement Approach as best practices. Services include:

- Evaluation/Assessment
- Individualized Treatment Planning and review
- Individual, Group and Family Counseling
- Drug and Alcohol Education and Relapse Prevention
- Anger Management Prevention and Skill-Building
- Self-Help Meetings (Alcoholics Anonymous/Narcotics Anonymous)
- Urinalysis drug screens when indicated
- Case Management to assist with coordination of services
