The Gap Program offers the following services to support your family through our MCH Family Outreach offices:

Case Management

We assess the strengths and needs of your situation and a case manager meets with your family regularly to provide you with services geared toward strengthening your family.

Information and Referral

We help you access community resources and programs to assist you with everything from counseling and parent training to food assistance and childcare services.

Support Groups

Caregiver Empowerment Groups offer emotional support and advice on ways to deal with common problems many grandparents and caregivers face when raising children.

Assistance with Legal Issues

We help you find community programs and government agencies that provide legal assistance.

Workshops

We partner with other like-minded community organizations that offer workshops on topics important to you as a generational caregiver.

MCH Family Outreach

Family Solutions provides help to families by providing advocacy and support, connection to resources in the community, and other services. Services are designed for families with at least one child residing in the home between the ages of birth to 14 years. Eligible families should also live within a 45-mile radius of an MCH Outreach office.

The program provides a combination of individual and family services, case management, and advocacy to help the family meet its needs. We help families gain access to community resources that will help their children grow to be healthy and successful at home, at school and in the community.

MCH Family Outreach case managers work with individuals and other people in your family and neighborhood who are important to you. We work with you to identify and build on your family's strengths to help you meet your needs and those of your children. We meet with you in your home, your child's school, or anywhere in the community where you are comfortable...as often as needed.

All MCH Family Solutions services are confidential and free to eligible families.
