The Region 6 office in Fort Worth TX partners with the State highway safety offices in Arkansas, Louisiana, New Mexico, Oklahoma, Texas and the Indian Nations to help manage effective federal safety grant programs in the states. In addition, NHTSA works tirelessly to reduce drunk driving and raise the use of safety belts/child safety seats, as well as to address other problems identified by data that contribute significantly to the deaths, injuries and crashes occurring on America's roads.
