



## Health Impact Assessment

The New Mexico Health Equity Partnership is working in collaboration with Human Impact Partners to conduct Health Impact Assessments (HIA) throughout New Mexico in rural and tribal areas. Local HIA teams work with community members to make a judgment about how a proposed plan or policy will affect health. HIA takes into consideration the current health status of a community, predicts how this will change if a proposed plan or policy is implemented and provides recommendations based on community knowledge, stories and quantitative data to inform and improve decision making processes.

Additionally, the NMHEP recently executed a HIA Technical Assistance Training Program to build the capacity of a local cohort of community members in the NE, SW and NW regions to provide technical assistance tailored to the needs of New Mexico HIA teams. To our knowledge, this is the first HIA technical assistance training program in the country.
