



## **Acoma Keres Language Level 1 Textbook**

The Project serves the Acoma Tribal community, both speakers and non-speakers of the Keres language. The oldest continuously inhabited community in the US, the Pueblo of Acoma (“Haak’u” in Keres) is a National Trust for Historic Preservation Historic Site. But while the physical infrastructure of Pueblo of Acoma Nation has been safeguarded, its linguistic heritage is in critical danger of being irrevocably lost. The tribe estimates that today, only 30 fluent speakers of Keres remain. To save the Keres language the Pueblo of Acoma has partnered with The Language Conservancy (TLC) for the Keres Language Recovery project. This multi-year project will create the linguistic infrastructure needed to safeguard the Keres language for future generations.

Currently, TLC and the Pueblo of Acoma are working on a beginner, Level 1, Keres language textbook and accompanying Audio CDs. This textbook will be used to teach the Keres language in the Sky City school district reaching over 600 Acoma children. The textbook and Audio CDs will follow TLC’s proven work strategy for developing linguistic infrastructure. TLC has used this strategy to develop effective materials for the Lakota, Crow, Hidatsa, and other tribes. This textbook will be a major step in preserving the Keres language and safeguarding a cornerstone of the Acoma culture for future generations.
